The owners of Morning-side's Sustainable Man are first-time nominees in the 2010 *South-East Advertiser Business Achiever Awards' Commercial & Home Trades* category.

Ms Duncan said Sustainable Man sold products and offered advice to turn homes and businesses into greener, more sustainable places.
